**In the One Hundred and Eighty-Ninth General Court
(2015-2016)**

An Act to further define medical necessity determinations.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives in General Court assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1 SECTION 1. Section 8A of Chapter 118E, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition, is
2 hereby amended by inserting at the end of the definition “Medically necessary services” the
3 following sentence:-

4 “Medically necessary services for mental health treatment shall be determined by the
5 treating clinician in consultation with the patient and noted in the patient’s medical record.”

6 SECTION 2. Section 16 (b) of Chapter 176O, as appearing in the 2012 Official Edition,
7 is hereby amended by inserting after the word “restriction.”, in line 33, the following sentence:-

8 “Medical necessity for mental health services shall be determined by the treating clinician
9 in consultation with the patient and noted in the patient’s medical record.”
